## Summary

By application dated June 17, 2022, superseded August 31, 2022, the Los Alamos Field Office (LFO) requested renewal of Certificate of Compliance (CoC) No. 9519 for the Model No. SAFESHIELD 2999A. LFO did not request any changes to the package design or authorized contents, and no changes were made to the operating procedures or for the maintenance of the package.

## Evaluation

The current DOE CoC Revision 5 is based on *Safety Analysis Report for Packaging (SARP) SAFESHIELD 2999A Package Docket 99-7-9519*, Revision 5, October 17, 2011, and SARP pages changes Revisions 6 (September 26, 2016) and 7 (March 21, 2017). The applicant submitted a consolidated SARP Revision 8 (June 17, 2022) in support of this application for renewal, which was superseded by SARP Rev. 9 (August 31, 2022) to correct editorial comments from DOE PCP staff's review comments on Rev 7. (5/31/2022) and Rev. 8 (8/11/2022). Staff confirmed on 9/30/2022 all corrections were made and properly implemented in SARP Rev. 9.

## Conditions of Approval

The following changes to CoC Rev. 5 are required for renewal and issuance of CoC Rev. 6:

- Condition 5(c)(9) revised to remove SARP supplement references.
- Condition 5(c)(10) revised to "Revision 5 of this certificate may be used until 9/30/2023."
- Supplement 5(d) revised to "None."

## Conclusion

Based on the statements contained in the safety basis document, SARP Revision 9, and the conditions listed above, DOE PCP staff concludes that the package continues to meet the requirements of 10 CFR Part 71, and the certificate be renewed for a five-year term until September 30, 2027.
